Nina Clausen Aida – Cast Theben

The Danish-born soprano will sing the title role of our AIDA - Aida. Nina Clausen's unconventional nature is also evident in her repertoire, which ranges from classics and standard works to a whole series of experimental productions. Nina celebrates her debut in our AIDA in the role of a modern, strong Aida. Nina, is there anything that you have always wanted to say? "What I want to say? Actually, I do say this at every opportunity: Vulnerability is the most important thing if you want to connect on a deeper level with other humans. It takes Courage, but it's worth it. I use this hardearned wisdom in my daily life, but also as a singer: Only when I dare to be vulnerable on stage and show a little part of my real self can I truly touch the audience. So that's my aim. Always!"

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Yana Kleyn Aida – Cast Memphis

Yana will take on the title role of Aida in our Memphis cast and it won't be the first time she has sung it so far. She is trained as a pianist at the Gnesins Academy of Music from a young age and finished her many years of musical training with a Master at the Academy of Music and Dramatic Arts in Denmark, where she moved from Moscow and where she still lives today. She recently sang Cio-Cio in Puccini's Madame Butterfly, a role for which BR-Klassik described her as "a discovery in terms of performance and a sensation in terms of singing". Yana, what did you want to be when you were a little girl?

"I thought that I would become a pianist or a dancer, but my secret dream was to be a rock singer. I think I have come as close as possible to that dream despite no rock voice talent... (2)"

Amneris - Cast Memphis

For the mezzo-soprano, who was born in Montreal (Can) and lives in Berlin, the role of Amneris is not an unknown one. She already sang the role in the 2021/2022 season at "Den Jyske Opera" (Arhus, DK) and also in the 2022/23 season she sang Amneris at the Royal Danish Opera in Copenhagen. During her career, which has taken her to the opera houses of Zurich, Amsterdam, Copenhagen, Paris, Naples, Essen, Cologne, Graz, the Met in New York, Seattle, Bellas Artes in Mexico or Tokyo, she has held numerous leading roles. Conductors such as Christoph Eschenbach, Sir John Eliot Gardiner, Marc Minkowski, Leif Segerstam or Franz Welser-Möst invited her to sing in concerts and soon, under the direction of our conductor Michael Ellis Ingram, she will embody Amneris in our AIDA.



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Sophia Maeno Amneris – Cast Theben

With the mezzo-soprano Sophia from Schwerin, we have found the perfect cast for Amneris, daughter of the Egyptian king and rival of Aida. Her repertoire is rich and versatile. Nor is this the first time she has sung the role of Amneris. Sophia, which prejudice about opera singers is wrong/which one is true? "Hahaaa... Well, there's probably some truth in every cliché. In any case, for me the term "diva" has a rather positive connotation: singers who perform at the highest level achieve an enormous amount physically, mentally, and artistically, and in order to live up to these demands and expectations in the long term, they need a corresponding buffer or protective zone. So, what a diva artificially builds up around herself is not necessarily reprehensible."

Yes, we have elitist elements in this art form, and we have welcoming and emotional elements. That speaks to all people regardless beyond language and cultural connection. It is the reason Nessun Dorma can bring a stadium of opera lovers and haters to tears."
